MINOR: Under 14 on 31st December in the year of competition. 200m/6km/2km JUNIOR: Under 15 on 31st December in the year of competition. 300m/8km/2.5km INTERMEDIATE: Under 17 on 31st December in the year of competition. 400m/10km/3km SENIOR: Under 19 on 31st December in the year of competition. 400m/12km/3.5km

Insurance

Robust Public liability insurance up to €6,500,000. This applies to all sanctioned events.

Income

Host club will retain all entry fees.

Triathlon Ireland will also pay a grant of €1,000 to the host club on successful completion of the event.

Sponsorship

The local organising committee (LOC) must share advertising space on the field of play and on-site branding with Triathlon Ireland along with its sponsors inclusive of finish shoot and transition area.

The category exclusivity of Triathlon Ireland's title sponsor or series sponsor cannot be infringed upon. Triathlon Ireland will work with the local organising committee where additional sponsorship is obtained locally providing no conflict of interest exists between any parties.

Event Criteria

A club must be able to provide a minimum amount of marshalls and volunteers to safely run the event. The exact amount of marshalls and volunteers will be given once a venue has been identified and an event and safety plan has been completed. Only after the this will a decision be made if the club can host the event

Venue: The host club must have access to or provide the following:

a minimum of a 25 metre pool with at least 5 lanes; or safe open-water swimming area;

an area for registration and presentation;

changing and toilet facilities;

Bike: A closed road section or area for the minor and junior age categories and a safe open road bike course for the intermediate and senior age categories. The surface cannot be grass. A hard gravel or tarmac surface is preferred; A transition area capable of holding 200 bikes;

The run section can be run on a looped or out and back course and can be grass, hard gravel or tarmac surface;

Medical Room.

Motorcycle Officials

Triathlon Ireland trained motorcycle officials to ensure the highest quality and safety measures are employed at all DS events.

Number of Motorcycle Officials appointed will be dependent on expected entries, race distance and as Technical Committee advise.

Technical Officials

Highly qualified and experienced Technical Officials guaranteed. Technical Officials are qualified through Triathlon Ireland's internal programme based on the International Triathlon Union's training and rules.

Technical Delegate and Referee will be appointed to all events.

Number of additional Technical Officials appointed will be dependent on expected entries, race distance and as the Technical Committee advise.

Local Organising Committee Delivery Requirements [1/3]



Race Delivery

Must be an affiliated club or organisation for 2019 before the event will be published.

The event and safety plan must be received a minimum two months prior to the event.

Triathlon Ireland will provide the 2019 event and safety plan template which must be used for all events.

The local organising committee should communicate effectively with Triathlon Ireland on a regular basis.

All events will be required to comply with Ti's Clean Sport policy and provide the necessary information for testing at their event.

Results & Timing

Results must be returned to Triathlon Ireland in the format provided within 48 hours.

Safeguarding Requirements

Junior events will need to comply with the following Safeguarding requirements:

1. Appoint a qualified Designated Person (vetted, signed code of conduct, completed Safeguard 1 course). The name and contact number of this person should be made available on the day.

EMP to be approved by TI National Childrens Officer 30 days prior to the event.

- 2. Complete the Safeguarding section of the Junior Event Management Plan which includes:
- a) Safeguard Risk Assessment
- b) Volunteers:

Sufficient number of volunteers to have one fully qualified junior leader/coach supervising each section (start, swim, bike, run, transitions, finish, changing area etc.) of the race and the volunteers in that section.

Sufficient volunteer so that juniors are never out of sight of a marshall.

- c) Medical cover
- d) Handover protocol at the finish handing juniors back to parent/guardian.
- e) Managing photography at the event and photography guidelines distribution.

Local Organising Committee Delivery Requirements [2/3]



Registration System

Using the Triathlon Ireland entry system will be favoured.

Benefits of the Triathlon Ireland entry system:

Race entry fees can be transferred to you prior to the event.

Allows to advertise purchase of merchandise.

Triathlon Ireland handle all customer service in relation to any queries, refunds etc.

Allows Athlete to see race schedule.

No sign on sheets required for your event, saving a huge amount of time.

Payments can be made with all major credit/debit cards credit.

Competitors can only enter the race if they meet the minimum

Track payments and manage refunds all in one place.

Access to reporting and analytics.

Discount codes.

Greater convenience for competitors as they can now locate races on the calendar and purchase them in one location.

Local Organising Committee Delivery Requirements [3/3]



Bid Evaluation:

Bids will be assessed and evaluated based on the following criteria:

- a) Geographical location and the number of events in the region
- b) Time of the season/ Event Date
- c) Experience of the local organising committee
- d) Quality of the bid application
- e) Previous Technical Official Reports
- f) Capacity of the event

- g) Marketing & Communications easy accessibility of information for competitors
- h) Quality of spectator experience
- i) Long term event development plans
- j) Course design
- k) Availability of marshalls and volunteers
